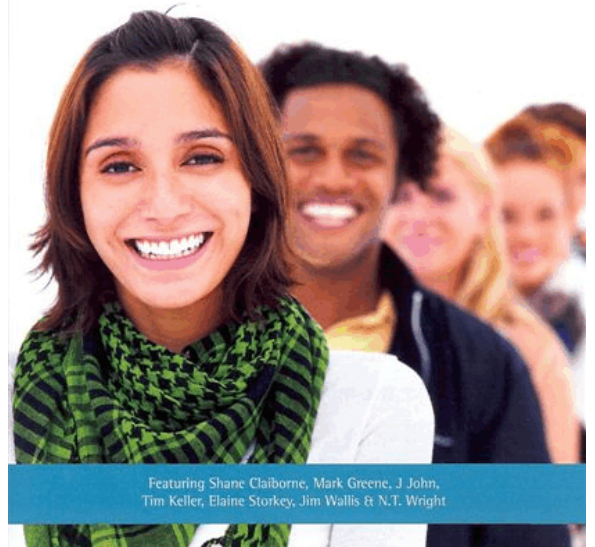

CHRISTIAN AID WEEK

May 10th - 16th - will focus on the **Democratic Republic of Congo** whose people are caught in bitter conflict.

More than 250,000 people have fled their homes, losing family and possessions on the way. Some are trying to return home despite the dangers. Many are being given shelter and food by local families who in turn will also need our support. Christian Aid is working with four local partners to reach more than 9,000 households. They are distributing food supplies, improving local water supplies and sanitation facilities, providing seeds and tools to help people grow extra food for their families, supporting people to earn vital income and find new livelihoods, and providing mobile voluntary HIV testing and counselling. As well as in the DR Congo, there are also massive humanitarian crises in Sri Lanka, Gaza, and, of course, Zimbabwe.

The TACT service to mark **CHRISTIAN AID WEEK** will be held on Sunday May 10th at the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady of Assumption, Tavistock starting at 6:00pm. St Eustachius are holding 2 coffee mornings for Christian Aid - Wednesday 13th May at 11am and Friday 15th May at 9:30am.

COMMITMENT FOR LIFE : Silveira House, Zimbabwe

Commitment for Life is a network of United Reformed Churches and Local Ecumenical Partnerships committed to praying, giving and campaigning for change in 4 partner countries - Bangladesh; Israel and the occupied Palestinian territories; Jamaica and Zimbabwe.

As a Church, Tavistock URC is linked with Silveira House in Zimbabwe.



A LIFE GIVING APPRENTICESHIP

Portia is 35 years old and lives in Mutoko in Zimbabwe. She has HIV. In 2006 she became very ill - nearly dying - and spent 6 months in a clinic. She then managed to get retroviral medication which she has been taking for over two years and will have to take for the rest of her life. However she now leads a healthy life.



At first she got the medicine free but now has to pay for it

In need of a regular income, Portia has been training as a hairdresser with the Silveira House apprentice programme, supported by Commitment for Life.

In spite of the turmoil facing Zimbabwe and the inflation rate making saving impossible, Portia now has **hope** - thanks to Silveira House. Even though the medicine is expensive, it is her priority - it has to be.

Many people in Zimbabwe are frightened to tell anyone they have HIV but Portia's family and the other hairdressing apprentices have been very supportive. Portia now feels able to share her experiences with others. "When I see someone who is sick I want to

comfort them and say <Don't be afraid - once I was sick like you, now I take medicines and I am fine.> I want people to be encouraged so that they can get tested before it's too late".

Portia and the other trainee hairdressers have HIV training as part of their programme - Portia wants to do more of this work and fight the stigma surrounding HIV, as few people in Zimbabwe seek testing for fear of discrimination.

Lord of justice and wisdom, in whom we place our hope, we place before you the crisis facing the country of Zimbabwe.

We pray for immediate aid, wise leadership and an end to injustice at this critical time, as disease and extreme food shortages threaten to grip the nation.

Compassionate God, we know of your special love for the poor. We pray for relief for those who suffer, and action from those who watch their suffering.

As we stand alongside the people of Zimbabwe in prayer, we passionately oppose the social injustice and oppression affecting that nation.

We know that your love extends further than we can ever ask or imagine and pray for your protection, healing and close presence there.

In Jesus name we pray. Amen

TAVISTOCK AREA CHRISTIANS TOGETHER



Street Pastors is an inter-denominational Church response to urban problems, engaging with people on the streets to care, listen and dialogue.

It was pioneered in London in January 2003 by Rev Les Isaac, Director of the Ascension Trust, and has seen some remarkable results, including drops in crime in areas where teams have been working. There are now over 100 teams around the United Kingdom - including one in Plymouth.

Each city project is set up by the Ascension Trust and run by a local coordinator with support from Ascension Trust, local churches and community groups in partnership with Police, Council and other statutory agencies.

On **Thursday May 14th at 7:30pm in the Abbey Chapel** there will be a meeting open to all to discuss the idea of having STREET PASTORS in Tavistock. A presentation will be given by the Revd Stuart Clarke - the Plymouth Street Pastors coordinator - who will be able to answer queries.

The following information is from an email sent by Graham Boot-Handford to TACT Churches..

"To get Street Pastors up and running will take a lot of time and effort from a team of people.

Management Structure: Street Pastors can be run under the umbrella of Ascension Trust, or a separate Charity structure can be set up. We would need to decide how the project would be managed in either circumstance - a managing board would be required - who should be on it? Two key appointments are the Co-ordinators, one for the Street Pastors, the other for the Prayer Pastors. We need to have the right people for these posts and they need to be in place early in the process. Both require a good deal of time.

Volunteers: To cover a Friday and Saturday night in Tavistock we estimate we would need in the order of 24 volunteer Street Pastors plus 12 -24 Prayer Pastors (the teams have people praying all the time they are out). The teams usually go out in 4s, so with 6 teams they would do 17-18 shifts per year.

Training: There is a training programme and it takes around 12 sessions, some of which can be done in the evening, but several will require to be completed on a Saturday. the minimum time it would take to complete the training would be 3 months.

Funding: Each Street Pastor costs £300 to train. Registering with Ascension Trust costs £250 and then 15% of donations raised. A very rough estimate would be that it could cost £10,000."

(Mr Boot-Handford is expecting the churches to pay for this!)

Other TACT events:

TAVI PRAISE will be held on Thursday May 7th 7:30pm at St Andrew's Whitchurch who will also host the Prayer Breakfast on Saturday May 16th at 8:30am and Evening Prayers on Thursday May 21st at 7:30pm.

From Sunday May 24th - Saturday May 30th there will be a week of prayer - 24 hours a day for 7 days - based at Abbey Chapel.
